About the CTI Resource Pack

Among the people who are working in or who have worked in developing countries, there is an obvious and natural need to pass on information and to share experiences. Similarly, people thinking about taking up this work have a similar need to find out as much as possible beforehand about what to expect, and to know of good sources of information and support once they are there.

This Resource Pack aims to utilise the knowledge and experience gained by people who have worked in under-resourced settings by putting information into one document. Hopefully, this then provides a ready source of "tried and tested" information which is easily accessible to people preparing to undertake this work. It is hoped also that this information will be a useful resource and reference for those currently working in the field.

This Resource Pack is divided up into sections according to the different areas of information. Inevitably there are instances where information could have been included in one of several different sections. In these cases cross-referencing has been attempted.

To search for particular areas of interest, for example, jobs in India or work with the deaf, use the **Find** option at the top of the page, typing in the key word then enter. It will then highlight the targeted words throughout the pack.

The information contained in the Resource Pack is not exhaustive, but tries to reflect what has been found to be most useful and relevant to date. Details presented here are currently accurate. However, situations change and details can quickly become out of date. CTI relies on its readers to keep informed and up to date, so please send in any additions or amendments to be included in the next edition.

How to find work









- There are various ways of finding work in countries where services for people with communication disability are recognised as a need and services are just developing.
- These include through a volunteer agency, such as with VSO, Skillshare International, IVS or others; fixed-term contract posts; private posts arranged directly with charities or individuals in the country; and posts which require sympathy with the organisation, e.g. religious missions.
- Many posts need experience with children, in particular in areas such as hearing loss, learning difficulties and physical disabilities, although this is not exhaustive.
- Teaching/training and informal sharing of skills with colleagues and care givers is usually an essential requirement. The development of new services, and the identification and inclusion of people with disabilities in their community, may also fall to the speech and language therapist or specialist teacher.
- Several papers have been written by speech and language therapists from the UK involved with working overseas. Refer to back copies of the "Bulletin", "Therapy Weekly" and "Speech & Language Therapy in Practice". There is also a special edition of the Journal Folia Phoniatica 2003 Vol 55 on developing services and related issues.
- The organisations listed here are involved with providing places for speech and language therapists to work in countries needing specialist support or acting as links with organisations providing related services.
- The situation with posts will vary with time and anyone interested should contact the organisations for up to date information.
- Every country has its own locally-based organisations and services for people with disabilities. It is also worth contacting the embassy or high commission within the country: they may have information about local organisations and services involved with people with disabilities.
- Please note, this list is not exhaustive, but does contain the more well-known organisations. Please send details of any other agencies to CTI for inclusion in the next Resource Pack.
